Ice Breaker

- 1. What are you thankful for right now?
- 2. When you celebrate, what does celebration look like? Is it a party with tons of people? A quiet word of encouragement to someone? Something else?

Going Deeper

- 1. Is there anything that stood out to you from Sunday's message, or do you have any questions?
- 2. This week's message focused on celebration as being the first step in being a disciple. What do you think about that? Why does celebration matter?
- 3. Read Psalm 118 together.
- 4. This Psalm begins with the admonition to give thanks to the Lord. Why are we to give thanks to the Lord?
- 5. What does it mean that God is good and that His love endures forever? Particularly what does love mean?
- 6. Is there a particular line or idea in this Psalm that stands out for you?
- 7. Martin Luther, the 16th-century church reformer, said this was his favourite Psalm. If you know who Luther was, or a bit about the reformation, why do you think this might have been his favourite?
- 8. Re-read verses 22-24.
- 9. Jesus quotes this passage in Matthew 21, and Peter does as well in his sermon in Acts 4:11. Who is the cornerstone (or capstone in some translations)? What does it mean that they are the cornerstone? In construction, what is the purpose of a cornerstone?
- 10. In the message, Rob challenged us to make a point of celebrating something each day for the next 30 days. Is celebration easy for you, or is it a challenge? What do you think incorporating celebration as a daily practice could do for you?
- 11. What is something we can celebrate together today?
- 12. How can we pray for each other?
