Ice Breaker

- 1. Are you more of a night owl or an early bird?
- 2. If you had the opportunity for a 'nighttime conversation' with Jesus, what would be the one burning question or topic you would want to discuss with him?"

Going Deeper

- 1. Is there anything that stood out to you from Sunday's message, or do you have any questions?
- 2. Read John 3:1-15
- 3. Why do you think Nicodemus came to Jesus at night?
- 4. Nicodemus may have gone to Jesus at night because he didn't want anyone to know he was going to see him. Have you ever felt a similar hesitation or curiosity about exploring your faith?
- 5. Based on the conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus in John 3:1-18, what does it mean to be born again?
- 6. Why do you think Jesus chose to discuss the concept of being born again with Nicodemus?
- 7. How might understanding the concept of being born again impact your own spiritual life?
- 8. In verses 14 and 15 Jesus uses the analogy of the snake in the wilderness from Numbers 21:4-9. What does it mean? What can we understand about receiving eternal life based on that story?
- 9. Pastor Rob emphasizes that only Jesus can provide the salvation and wholeness that individuals seek. How does this understanding change your approach to faith and your relationship with Jesus?
- 10. Why is it important to remember that religious practices, knowledge, and attendance at church alone cannot save a person?
- 11. Jesus explains to Nicodemus that being born again means experiencing a spiritual rebirth, a transformation in which God works anew in a person's life. In what ways have you experienced or hope to experience spiritual rebirth in your own life?
