2. Read John 1:29-51
3. What stands out to you from the stories we read?
4. What significance is there to the title "The Lamb of God" that John uses for Jesus?
5. In verse 34, John the Baptist testifies Jesus is the "chosen one" or Messiah. What expectations did people have for the Messiah during that time?
6. Why do you think two of John's followers followed Jesus?
7. What does Jesus' response to their question tell you about Jesus in verse 39?
8. What does the invitation to 'come and see' mean in terms of our relationship with Jesus?
9. In the message, Rob encouraged us to experience Jesus for ourselves and make encountering Him a priority in our lives. What steps can you take to 'come and see' Jesus in your own life?
10. Share your experiences of encountering Jesus, either through scripture, prayer, or other ways. How has it affected your life?
11. How do you think Simon reacted to Jesus changing his name to Peter? What does Jesus renaming him mean?
12. When Jesus met Peter and saw potential in him, how does this illustrate Jesus' ability to see beyond our failures and disappointments?
13. Jesus gave Peter a new name, which means 'rock,' despite his past disappointments. Have you experienced a time when you felt like a failure but were encouraged by your relationship with Jesus?
14. How does Jesus' meeting Nathaniel in his skepticism show Jesus' ability to meet us where we are?
15. Jesus showed Nathaniel that he saw him under a fig tree before Philip called him, convincing Nathaniel of Jesus' divinity. How can you be open to Jesus meeting you in your doubts or skepticism?
16. In the message, Rob stated that "If you're looking for Jesus, he is looking to meet you." How might this assurance impact your approach to faith and seeking God?
