Going Deeper	<ol> <li>Is there anything that stood out to you from Sunday's message, or do you have any questions?</li> <li>Read John 15:1-17</li> <li>What stands out to you from the text?</li> <li>What does Jesus mean when He refers to Himself as the "true vine" in John 15:1?</li> <li>How does the image of Jesus as the vine and believers as the branches illustrate the importance of spiritual connectedness?</li> <li>What can we learn about our spiritual growth based on this image?</li> <li>Have you ever felt pressure to "do more" in your life, whether in work, relationships, or your faith? How did that impact you?</li> <li>How does the metaphor of Jesus as the true vine and believers as branches challenge or inspire you?</li> <li>In what ways do you see the principles of abiding in Jesus applying to your daily life?</li> <li>Can you identify moments in your life when you've experienced growth or fruitfulness as a result of staying connected to Jesus?</li> <li>How does the concept of "remaining in the vine" as a foundation for living a full life. How does this challenge traditional notions of success and achievement?</li> <li>How can we prioritize our relationship with Jesus over productivity and accomplishments in our daily lives?</li> <li>In the sermon, it was emphasized that remaining close to Jesus and nurturing a relationship with Him is more important than our productivity, that proximity should be pursued over productivity. What steps can you take in your own life to focus on building a closer relationship with Jesus, rather than chasing doing more?</li> <li>How can we encourage each other as a group to prioritize our proximity to Jesus?
