- 1. What is something not so serious that you are afraid of?

Going Deeper

- 1. Read 2 Corinthians 5:11-20.
- 2. One of the challenges in the Corinthian church during Paul's writings was that some of the people decided there were super-apostles, people they viewed as more spiritual than Paul. Likely this had to do with how these super-apostles ministered, likely exhibiting supernatural gifts and being more eloquent. At the same time, Paul tended to be more straightforward and more ordinary in his approach.
 - Do you think sometimes we follow people still today based on how they present themselves more than by the message they share? Why do you think that is?
- 3. Based on 5:11-15, why does Paul behave the way he does, in ways that are different from what the Corinthians were expecting?
- 4. What does verse 15 mean? How would you apply that to your life?
- 5. What does it mean to regard people from a worldly point of view? What are some examples of how we may do that?
- 6. Why is Paul concerned that we should not look at people from a worldly point of view?
- 7. What does it look like to be a new creation?
- 8. Paul attaches responsibility to the reality of being a new creation. What is it? Why do you think he does that?
- 9. Why do you think Paul used the word ambassador or agent to describe what God invites us into?
- 10. What does it mean to be reconciled?
- 11. Who is someone you believe God is inviting you to help reconcile with? How can we pray for you in this?
- 12. Who do you think the church needs to work to bring the message of reconciliation to? How do you think we can do that at our church?
