- 8. During the message, Rob said that reading and hearing the Word of God (Scripture) was the beginning of our process of our spiritual life coming alive. Why might that be? What practices do you have a reading and hearing scripture?
- 9. The word prophesy used in this passage of scripture could be changed to the word preach. Why is hearing preaching an important thing for believers and nonbelievers?
- 10. What does it mean to be filled with the spirit? Why is being filled with the spirit important?
